I care deeply about our local community and am involved in a wide range of activities that include:

- ✓ Setting up the Ruscombe Brook Action Group, which is vigorously working to stop the raw sewage escaping into local fields, the brook and its Randwick tributary.
- ✓ Actively supporting the Ruscombe Valley Action Group to protect the beautiful valley from development following the sale of the land in 189 house-size plots.
- ✓ Organising a local campaign against the unscientific proposed badger cull.
- ✓ Writing a report into the planning problems and contamination at Aston Down airfield.
- ✓ Helping organise campaigns to save the Whiteshill and Paganhill Post Offices – and I opposed Tesco being allowed to eject the post office from the 'One Stop' shop.
- ✓ Calling for better consultation and care over roadside management, following the 80-plus trees felled near Haresfield Beacon and at other local sites.
- ✓ Supporting the wonderful Ruscombe and Whiteshill village shop and coffee bar to encourage more customers (best views with a coffee in the Five Valleys!).

My passions are social justice and learning how we can care better for our planet. I hope to show you that a vote for me is also a vote for you and the rest of the community.
